Big Goal

SIA's 2021-2031 Big Goal is to invest in the dreams of half a million women and girls through access to education. We will do this through our Dream Programs and Big Goal Accelerator Projects.

Big Goal Accelerator Projects

These are club projects that are not the Dream Programs but that do increase access to education for women and girls facing obstacles to their success. These are often scholarships, classes, or providing specific items required to access education.

Club Giving

Club Giving is the way your club can help women and girls beyond your local community. Clubs are asked to contribute at least 10 percent of the funds they raise locally to fund our life-changing global Dream Programs, and increase the number of women and girls who benefit. When your club contributes to Club Giving it ensures that more women and girls close to home and across the world will have access to our programs. More women will be able to overcome challenges such as racism, sex slavery, domestic violence, poverty and drug abuse, and live more fulfilling lives. More girls will be able to overcome obstacles, increase their self-esteem, and pursue their dreams. Convention

Held in even-numbered years, SIA conventions provide education, networking, cross-cultural and socializing opportunities. In addition to inspiring speakers and workshops, members also have the opportunity to participate in the decision-making process and meet Soroptimists from around the world.

Dream Big Campaign

The Dream Big Campaign will raise the funds necessary to reach our 2021-2031 goal of investing in the dreams of a half million women and girls through access to education. Launched publicly in September 2021 at our 100th Anniversary celebration, the campaign will run through August 2023. Funds raised through the campaign will build our organization's capacity in three program areas: delivery, expansion and sustainability. Gifts to the campaign are a special opportunity make a lasting impact for years to come.

Dream It, Be It: Career Support for Girls

Dream It, Be It is SIA's program that empowers girls to break cycles of racism, poverty, violence, and abuse by giving them the self-confidence and knowledge they need to achieve success. Through small group workshops or a conference setting, Soroptimists mentor girls on setting and achieving their goals, moving forward after setbacks or failures, and discovering career opportunities.

Founders Pennies

Celebrating the founding of Soroptimist, Founders Pennies are a classic, time-honored tradition for clubs to support SIA's Dream Programs in a creative way. They are collected by clubs in a variety of ways and are usually submitted with SIA dues. Founders Pennies are calculated by multiplying \$.06 per member times the number of years since Soroptimist's Founding in 1921. In the 2022-2023 club year, Founders Pennies are \$6.18 per member.

Laurel Legacy

The Laurel Legacy is SIA's way of recognizing and honoring the generosity of those whose future gifts preserve the strength of our organization, and help women and girls to live their dreams. Arranging a future gift to Soroptimist is an excellent way to guarantee that our programs will continue to help women and girls.

Laurel Society

The Laurel Society is SIA's prestigious recognition program for donors who contribute charitable gifts totaling \$1,000 or more. Since 1994, over 10,000 Laurel Society members have given over \$20 million dollars toward the economic empowerment of women and girls through our Dream Programs. Donors can choose to designate their gift to the *Live Your Dream Awards*, *Dream It*, *Be It*, or Unrestricted Support, which provides funding where it's needed most. These gifts can be given as one-time gifts or as part of a Stargazer Monthly Donation. Laurel Society members' generosity provides ongoing financial support beyond their membership dues, ensuring the organization's global programs have the funding needed to serve women and girls around the world.

Leadership Round Table

Leadership Round Table (LRT) is an evolution of the Governors Round Table, held annually—virtually in odd years, and face-to-face following the biennial convention in even years, and is open to ALL SIA members. This training is held so Soroptimists can access critical leadership development content. Whether you want to become a better overall leader or feed your interest in becoming a future Soroptimist leader, LRT is an opportunity to learn and be part of the ever-changing and growing Soroptimist organization.

Live Your Dream: Education and Training Awards for Women

Soroptimist clubs have supported women's empowerment through access to education since 1972 with this cornerstone program. The award-winning, life-changing *Live Your Dream Awards* assist women who provide

the primary source of financial support for their families by giving them the resources they need to improve their education, skills, and employment prospects.
